Ethics Commission Invites Ideas From The Public and State and Local Agencies for Potential Changes to the Ethics Law

CARSON CITY, NEVADA (February 28, 2022) – On February 16, the Nevada Commission on Ethics held a public meeting; the meeting included the following highlights:

- Resolution of Complaint No. 20-007C, *In re Steven Morris*, City Attorney, City of Boulder City. Resolved by Stipulated Consent Order.
- Discussion of Legislative priorities and agency updates
- Appointment of Commission Members Kim Wallin, Brian Duffin, and James Oscarson to a Legislative Subcommittee to prepare priority legislation requests for the 2023 Legislative Session

Commission Chair Kim Wallin encourages Nevadans to share their thoughts on potential legislative improvements: “We invite the members of the public and our partners in state and local government to submit ideas for enhancing and improving Nevada’s Ethics Law.” The Commission will be accepting legislative ideas and feedback through its main email ncoe@ethics.nv.gov and in meetings of its Legislative Subcommittee.

The next meeting of Nevada’s Commission on Ethics is March 16, 2022. The meeting will include a presentation on what types of government activity and behavior is covered under the Nevada Ethics Law and which behavior falls outside the scope of the Commission.
