REVIEW PANEL DETERMINATION
NRS 281A.730; NAC 281A.440

The Nevada Commission on Ethics (“Commission”) initiated this Ethics Complaint (“Complaint”) on January 8, 2026, regarding the alleged conduct of Subject Lisa Motley (“Subject”). On January 8, 2026, the Commission instructed the Executive Director to investigate alleged violations of NRS 281A.400(1), (2), (3), (5), (9), (10), and NRS 281A.420(1).

Subject is a former public employee as defined in NRS 281A.150 and NRS 281A.180, and the Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to NRS 281A.280 because the allegations contained in the Complaint relate to Subject’s conduct as a public employee and associated implications under the Ethics Law. Subject did not waive the statutory investigatory time limit of 70 days.

On March 24, 2026, a Review Panel consisting of Scott Scherer, Esq. (Presiding Officer), Commissioner Lowry, and Commissioner Moran considered the following: (1) Ethics Complaint; (2) Order Initiating Complaint by Motion; (3) Motley’s Response; and (4) Executive Director’s Recommendation to the Review Panel with Summary of Investigatory Findings and Relevant Evidentiary Exhibits.¹

Under NAC 281A.430, the Panel unanimously finds and concludes that the facts do not establish credible evidence to support a determination that just and sufficient cause exists for the Commission to render an opinion in the matter regarding the alleged violations of NRS 281A.400(1), (2), (3), (9), (10), and NRS 281A.420(1). The Panel further unanimously finds and concludes that the facts do establish credible evidence to support a determination that just and sufficient cause exists for the Commission to render an opinion in the matter regarding the alleged violations of NRS 281A.400(5) and refer the alleged violation of this statute to the full Commission for an opinion.
